








Billie B. Brown's Guide to



Making a FANCY Hat





- A hat base this could be an ice cream container (make sure there is no more ice cream in it!), a tissue box, a Tupperware container - anything that fits on your head, really. We used a cereal box!
- · Glue
- Scissors (get a grown-up to help)
- Fancy things to stick on your hat!
- An audience to parade your hat to! You could do a hat parade for your family, or you could take your hat on a parade of the neighborhood!

HOW TO MAKE: Ask your family if it's OK to do some gluing and painting. Then work out where you're going to do your fancy hat making, and cover that area with newspaper. This is REALLY important. Billie once forgot this step and accidentally glued a googly eye to the counter. Her mom and dad were NOT pleased!

Then, it's pretty simple really... Take your hat base and stick fancy things all over it!

This is a sight word game using words from *The Hat Parade*.


Roll along with Billie and Jack!

the illustrator of the Billie B. Brown books!

We asked Aki how she became an illustrator - because we know a lot of you are VERY good at drawing and perhaps when you grow up, you might become an illustrator too!



I have loved drawing since I was little — drawing has always been my favorite hobby and it still is! I would draw comics to tell stories. I was too shy to show them to my parents or friends, and shared them only with my sister. I didn't know that you could be an illustrator for a job — it was just fun for me. I always thought that when I was old, I would live deep in the woods with lots of cats and draw all day!

Other than art, my favorite subjects in school were math and science. I loved solving problems with numbers and formulas. I thought that when I grew up I would be a physicist — a type of scientist who gets to use lots of exciting math. Once I finished high school, I went to college to study physics — but after some encouragement from my mom, I also decided to study fine arts at the same time! Studying the fine arts is all about painting, sculpture and the history of art! I LOVED it, and after two years, I decided to study only art.


My teachers taught us about being original, inventive and to learn from history. My classmates and I studied masterpieces created by other artists, and then tried to come up with something original ourselves. Once, we got to choose our own homework so I chose to draw a comic, just like I used to make when I was a kid! This project was so fun, and I even won awards for it!

After I graduated, I kept drawing more comics. Once I decided that I definitely wanted my job to be an illustrator, I put together a portfolio — like a big photo album of my illustrations — and sent it out to over fifty book publishers in New Zealand and Australia. After a long time, two publishers came back to me and offered me some illustrating jobs. One of those publishers was Hardie Grant Egmont, asking me to illustrate a chapter book series about a bold, brilliant and bubbly girl — called Billie B. Brown!

That was over ten years ago, and since then I have illustrated over eighty books — and drawing is my job! Now I just need to get lots and lots of cats, and all my dreams will have come true!



Here are some of the things I did to become an illustrator that might help you!



- I eventually grew the courage to share my work not just with my sister, but also with my parents! Their encouragement helped me decide to study art in college.
- I listened carefully to my teachers, and researched lots of other artists from history to figure out my own style.
- · I practiced lots and lots to improve my skills.
- · I always kept trying, and having fun!





Cook a Yummy, Healthy Lunch!

Sometimes she makes special treats. But most of the time she likes to make yummy, healthy food! Here is her favorite lunch recipe - maybe you could try and make it at home!



Recipe: VEGGIE FRITTERS

Prep time: 10 mins

Cooking time: 10-20 mins

Makes: 12

Don't forget to wash your dishes when you're done!

around 4 cups veggies (Pick your favorites! I like zucchini, sweet potato and corn.)

1 egg

1/2 cup grated cheese

1 1/2 cup all-purpose flour (or chickpea flour for gluten free)

> I clove minced garlic or 1 teaspoon crushed garlic

2 tablespoons olive oil

No matter what she wants to cook, Billie always asks a grown-up if it's OK before she starts. And she always, always asks for help when she's using the stove or oven. You should do that, too!

METHOD

- Preheat the oven to 350 degrees and line a baking sheet with nonstick parchment.
- Grate vegetables.
 - Remove excess moisture from zucchini by placing grated zucchini in a clean tea towel, scrunching it together and squeezing until towel is damp.
- Repeat with the sweet potato - place it in a clean towel and squeeze out the moisture.
 - Whisk the egg in a large bowl.
 - Recipe published with

and mix together.

Add the cheese, flour, garlic and oil into the bowl and combine.

Add the veggies to the bowl

- Roll mixture into balls and flatten down the top. Each fritter should measure approximately 3 in. wide. Place onto baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
- Once tray is full, brush fritters with olive oil and bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes, until the fritters are golden.
