



**The Wrong Fairy Tale**  
**Cinderella and the Seven Dwarfs**  
By Tracey Turner, illustrated by Summer Macon

As you read along, ask the child the following questions:

- What do you suppose is causing the noise the dwarfs hear?
- Why do you think the stepsisters leave Cinderella at home to do the housework?
- Who else can you spot in Cinderella's house?
- Why do the dwarfs make Cinderella a ball gown? What have they used to make the gown?
- How are the dwarfs planning to take Cinderella to the ball?
- What does Cinderella like about the ball? What doesn't she like?
- Why does the prince go looking for Cinderella?
- How did Cinderella feel when she opened the door to the footman holding Helpful's book?
- Why do the dwarfs offer to share their home with Cinderella?
- How did Cinderella help the dwarfs?



Further questions and activities for after reading the book.

- Ask which is their favorite page in the book and why.
- If the child is familiar with the traditional Cinderella story, ask how this story is different. Which do they prefer?
- Encourage the child to make up a story in which some other fairy-tale character comes along to help Cinderella go to the ball. Suggest they draw pictures for their story.
- Together, choose two other fairy tales and help the child to mix them up to make up and illustrate their own "Wrong Fairy Tale."
