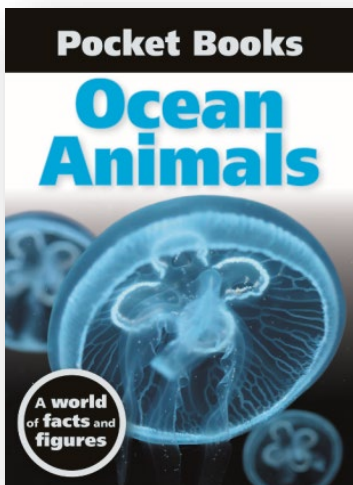



Weight 1.5 to 1.6 tons Life span 32 to 40 years Predators Orcas, polar bears, humans</p> <p>Diet The beluga whale will eat almost anything that lives on or near the ocean floor: octopuses, squid, crabs, sandworms and bony fish like flounder.</p> <p>Fact This whale is known for its vocalization, and its nickname is the "sea canary." It has about eleven sounds, including whistles, squeals, clucks and trills.</p> <p>Conservation status Near threatened</p>	<p>Sperm Whale <i>Physeter macrocephalus</i></p> <p>Ocean animals Mammals Whales, dolphins and porpoises</p>  <p>Factfile</p> <p>Habitat Oceans, especially in deep waters Distribution Worldwide (except polar Arctic region) Size 40 to 42 ft. Weight Up to 63 tons Life span Up to 70 years</p>
<p>Caracal <i>Caracal caracal</i></p> <p>Predators Mammals Wild cats</p>  <p>Factfile</p> <p>Habitat Dry woodlands, savannahs Distribution Africa, Asia Length 2.1 to 3 ft. (body), 7 to 13.5 in. (tail) Weight 24 to 40 lb. Life span 12 to 15 years Predators Lions, leopards, hyenas</p> <p>Diet The caracal's diet consists of hyraxes, hares, rodents, birds, antelopes, monkeys and reptiles. Smaller prey are killed with a bite to the neck.</p> <p>Fact The caracal does not turn away from predators even twice its size, but will chase them down. It will hide larger prey under soil for later eating.</p> <p>Conservation status Least concern</p>	<p>Serval <i>Leptailurus serval</i></p> <p>Predators Mammals Wild cats</p>  <p>Factfile</p> <p>Habitat Reed beds, grasslands, forests, thickets, marshes Distribution Southern and northern Africa Length 26 to 39 in. (head/body), 12 in. (tail) Weight 20 to 40 lb. Life span 12 to 20 years Predators Humans, leopards, hyenas</p> <p>Diet The serval usually hunts in long grass for birds, rodents and other small mammals, frogs and insects. It will also take to the water for fish.</p> <p>Fact The serval detects prey with its excellent hearing, uses its height advantage to locate it and its long, powerful legs to pounce on it or leap up to it.</p> <p>Conservation status Least concern</p>
